We ask that You guide them to be good role models and loving to their children.


We also ask that You help them to be a father like You are.


2019 Voice of Youth **Penrith Cluster Final**



Here is what some of the students are saying......




Here are some of the questions you could be asking.....

- In the environment, what does a 'revolution?'
- What is the name of the angle that is smaller than or greater than a right angle? (Acute/Obtuse)

They have just finished a 5 week PBL unit with the Driving Question *How can we as ant farmers, monitor and control the development of ants in their habitat?* The students learnt about the features of an ant, its life cycle, how it grows and changes and the purpose of an ant. Did you know that ants are decomposers and seed dispersers?! Year 2 were required to demonstrate their learning about ants by creating a model with an informative visual display. 
YEAR 3 & 4 TOUCH FOOTBALL
